







In the heart of Lima, Ohio, the Brockman family's life took an unexpected turn when Halle Brockman, during her pregnancy, faced a challenging situation. Sent to Toledo Hospital due to pre-term labor, Halle and her husband Caleb found themselves far from home and family. However, fate broughtthem to a place that would become their sanctuary during this difficult time

The Brockman family's connection to the golden arches began years ago when 14-year-old Halle and Caleb crossed paths while working at McDonald's. Little did they know that years later, the same company would play a significant role in their lives in a completely different way. When Halle was admitted to Toledo Hospital, she was later discharged to RMHC as her contractions halted. Still, fate had its way, and her water broke during their stay, leading to the early arrival of their twin babies, McKenna and McKinley, at just 30 weeks.

Halle expressed her gratitude, saying, "It is cool to see where the McDonald's support goes to and how it helps all the families we are surrounded by. You never realize how much it helps until you see it."

Halle expressed her admiration for the dedicated staff, stating, "Everyone has been amazing, All of the Family Service Managers have gone above and beyond for us. If we have an issue, they are there as soon as we need them." The caring and attentive staff not only ensured the well-being of Halle and her newborns but also provided much-needed emotional support for their entire family. Their two-year-old daughter, Madilyn, was also welcomed into the House, where she found joy in the playground and playroom.

The Brockman family's journey at RMHC exemplifies the impact this organization has on families facing challenging circumstances. By providing a home away from home and a supportive community, RMHC offers families the strength to cope with their struggles. As Halle puts it, "The staff has made it ten times easier just by being there and supporting us."
